

Who we Serve

Center for Community Resources, Inc. provides a variety of programs in support of Human Services needs for Butler County residents. Below is a breakdown of programs and appropriate audiences:

Children and Adolescents

CCR offers **Early Intervention Services** for children birth to three (3) who have a qualifying diagnosis, developmental delays, or a substantial risk of significant delays and assists families in accessing services and supports in order to help their child maximize their developmental potential.

Our **Children's Services Program** focuses on behavioral and developmental issues with regard to children's mental health and assist in facilitating Wrap-around supports, as well as Residential Treatment Facility placement, as required. This program also coordinates with C&Y and Juvenile Probation Services.

When schools, parents, students, or Social Service Agencies recognize a student at risk for academic achievement, referral to our **Student Assistance Program** provides a Liaison who will work with the schools and referring individuals in order to provide supports and services designed to help students overcome learning barriers, remain in school, and advance.

The agency **Information and Referral Program** provides Case Management services for children who do not qualify for traditional services and supports, but require community resources to help families meet their needs.

Mental Retardation Supports Coordination is available to any child over the age of 3 who has been identified to have the potential for significant subaverage functioning. Supports Coordination services assists the child and the family through the Mental Retardation Service System and puts in place a process by which the individual's life changes receive the supports necessary for an Everyday Life (school transitions, employment, day time activities, equipment needs, camp opportunities, etc.).

For some children, family issues can result in them being involved in other Agency programs, such as **CRISIS, utility needs, and homelessness**.

The agency provides supports for children diagnosed with **Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD)** in the form of Case Management through **Information and Referral Services**, as well as **BHRS** for Wraparound services to address behavior modification.

Young Adults

As above, the **Student Assistance Program** is available to students up to the age of 21 (with a disability and an IEP) for as long as they stay in school.

Mental Retardation Supports Coordination is a voluntary program that supports individuals identified with Mental Retardation from age 3 to end of life. The Supports Coordinator is actively involved with those young adults who receive Supports Coordination services as they transition from the educational environment to their post-secondary environment—what does the young adult want to accomplish after school? Services may include finding day programs, accessing vocational opportunities, living independently in the community, etc.

Adults

Mental Health Service Coordination is a function of the Mental Health Base Service Unit. Administrative Case Managers facilitate entry into the Mental Health System and collaborate with other programs (D&A, Criminal Justice, Hospitals, other CCR internal programs, etc.) on behalf of individuals and families, as well as connect them to other Human Services information and community resources. This service typically supports adults.

The **HOPE Program** provides housing assistance for chronically homeless, disabled, unaccompanied adult consumers (over the age of 18) with mental health and/or substance abuse disability.

CCR's **D&A Blended Case Management** services offers Intensive Case Management and Resource Coordination services to consumers with substance abuse issues. The services are designed to provide consumers assistance in support of a sober and drug-free lifestyle, while promoting stability around personal needs for housing, employment, child care, substance abuse treatment, health care, etc.) through goal setting service plans.

Crisis Intervention Services provide intervention, assessment, counseling, screening, and referral services for Butler County residents experiencing a behavioral health crisis 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. These services are not limited by age, and are available to those who telephone, walk-in, or request the Crisis team to come to the home, community, school environment (mobile) to facilitate crisis services for persons seeking immediate assistance.

Peer Support is an important aspect of recovery for persons with mental illness. The Peer Specialist is a person who identifies as a current or past consumer of Mental Health services in order to provide non-clinical support and services to individuals who are mentally ill.

The **HIV/AIDS Prevention and Education** program provides presentations, individual assessments, and referral for testing to any individual with risky behaviors, as well as to providers that provide service supports to them in order to reduce risk and promote a healthier lifestyle.

Families

Center for Community Resources, Inc. is the host agency to **Butler Collaborative for Families**, a grant-funded program, which has created a community-wide collaborative board that meets to build a unified and integrated network of services for the children and families of Butler County.

The **Utility Single Point of Contact** (USPOC) at Center for Community Resources, Inc. is an information and referral source available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (1-800-481-3653) for customers in need of information on utility bills, conservation practices and/or energy programs that can assist them for referral and relevant information.
